

The President shall sign all written contracts and other written obligations of the Society. No person shall serve more than two (2) successive full terms as President.	John Heinbokel, who is the current President, is term-limited, completing his two successive full terms. (It is not a requirement to serve 2 consecutive terms.)
Vice President	In the absence or disability of the President, the President's duties shall be performed by the Vice President. If the office of President shall become vacant, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the President until a President shall be elected. No person shall serve more than two (2) successive full terms as Vice President.  Although not defined in the Bylaws it is suggested that the VP participate with committees, help establish working committee structure, back up and succession plans and support activities.	Bob Travers is the current Vice President completing his first term. (He completed two successive terms as VP from 1996-1999). Bob has chosen not to continue as VP or be considered for the next President.
Treasurer	The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of the Society and will receive and deposit the Society's funds, prepare, and file and tax returns required to be filed by the Society, remit any taxes payable by the Society, and furnish a financial report at each regular Board of Trustees meeting. No person shall serve more than two (2) successive full terms as Treasurer.	Brenda Logan is the current Treasurer completing her first term. Brenda is willing to continue in her position however is looking for an assistant backup/alternate and successor.
Secretary	The Secretary shall take and maintain minutes of the business transacted at regular and special meetings of the Board of Trustees. No person shall serve more than five (5) successive full terms as Secretary.	Diane Elam is the current Secretary completing her first term. Diane is willing to continue in her position.
Directors	The Directors shall counsel the Board of Trustees and the members and Chairs of standing and special committees on the matters pertaining to the Society, the Board of Trustees, and such committees.  Although not defined in the Bylaws it is suggested that the Directors participate with committees, help establish working committee structure, back up and succession plans and support activities.	Chris Zajac and Kathi Jackson are both serving their first terms as Directors. There is no term limit for Directors.



## Roses are red, violets are blue. This is why orchids are too!



As with almost everything in life, the colors of our favorite flower are due to chemicals. One of the main classes of flower colors is anthocyanin. The core three anthocyanins are:

You can see that they are the same other than the –OH groups on the right side. Every clone — species or hybrids — will have one or more of these three pigments. Their presence will define the *possible* range of colors. Hybridizers have chosen parents for their colors, unconsciously picking plants with genes to produce these three. There is more to it, of course. There always is. The acidity of the flower, the pH where more than 7 is alkaline and less than 7 is acidic, will also affect the color of these three plant dyes.



Breeders have likewise chosen parents with genetic controls over the acidity of the flowers. Like a conductor of a big orchestra, we have harnessed the symphony of chemistry to delight our eyes and our souls.


