Clark's Corner: Getting the best out of Zoom

Zoom has become a fact of life for many of us. The Maryland Orchid Society added Zoom in the form of hybrid meetings during the COVID pandemic. We have continued the hybrid meetings to give everyone the chance to participate, even from long distances and in times of health and driving challenges. Out typical meetings these day will include 5 to 20 members joining in remotely. The Zoom portion requires a good bit of time investment at the meeting, and we'll admit that the quality has not been up to our hopes from time to time.

We have streamlined the offering to focus on what we do well. In particular, the presenters will now be required to provide their "slides" to be used on Zoom. What you will see at home is exactly what is projected on the screen in Fellowship Hall at Woodbrook. We will also have dedicated volunteers in the hall to monitor what is on Zoom to catch any audio or video glitches. We don't have control of everything you see, though. There are a number of controls on your Zoom page you should be aware of. We verified in the last meeting that good video was going out from the meeting, but some viewers did not see the fully available video.

There are several modes of showing the meeting. The most common is Gallery View. That view shows all of the Zoom attendees, each in their own window pane. If you want one of those individual panes to fill your window, move your cursor to the upper right-hand corner of the individual pane and from the dropdown menu, select "Pin". This would be the case to see the meeting during the business portion between the Virtual Show Table and the speaker's presentation and when the program consists of live demonstrations rather than slide presentations. The Virtual Show Table and slide presentations are shared screens which should automatically fill your window. In the week prior to the next meeting, you should get an invitation to a trial meeting to give you a chance to try out the controls and ask questions.


