#### Presidents Message

September's here already as we begin a new Program and Fiscal year. MOS is off and running! We have just completed the MOS outreach through the Maryland State Fair Orchid Exhibition. Before we get to the MOS September Monthly meeting we have our first away show of the season. September 18 will be the setup day for the National Capitol Orchid Society Show at Homestead Gardens in Davidsonville, MD. NCOS has moved their show date from the spring to the fall. Earn a show table point by lending a plant or 2. Let Valerie Lowe know if you can lend a plant or volunteer to help set up and/or tear down. More information is also in the newsletter.

The MOS September Monthly meeting is moved to September 25 one week later than usual. Joel Graham will provide the Showtable results for Program year 2024-2025. You would want to attend in person to collect your awards if you were able to participate and achieve at least 3 points. Show table participation is a privilege of MOS Membership. Membership is renewable annually, running from September through August of the next year with dues payable by September 30. Links to the renewal form are included in the newsletter and on the MOS Website. You are welcome to renew in person at any MOS Meeting. If you find yourself considering not renewing, I ask you to hang on a bit or at least let someone know why you are thinking of leaving, is there a need we could have fulfilled but haven't.

Now is the time to engage in your society. Support our outreach efforts, the MD State Fair next year, and Rawlings exhibitions, or volunteer to host at a hospitality table. Volunteer to assist in Workshops, Annual Auctions, our Annual Show, lend a plant for one or all the Away Shows, set up, and cleanup for monthly meetings, bring a snack to share at a meeting, borrow from the library. This is the beginning of the transition from membership to becoming a member of your Maryland Orchid Society.

## Maryland Orchid Society Showtable Rules Overview

Bring your blooming orchids in for display on our Show Table at the 10 Monthly Program Meetings.

1. Exhibitors must own and grow the plant or plants for at least six months in the Competitive Classes [A-M]. All plants should be groomed and free of pests.
2. Each exhibitor must fill out entry forms, listing all plants. Use one entry for all plants shown in each class. A fillable PDF is available on the Maryland Orchid Society website. [Microsoft Word - ShowTableEntryForm.doc](#)
3. Plants to be judged must be on the Show Table by 7:30 p.m. Plants brought in after this time may not be judged.

The Virtual Show Table is intended to provide Show Table participation; it is non-competitive and managed by a Coordinator.

1. Plants must have been photographed in bloom since the last meeting.
2. Exhibitors must email a picture along with the typed name of each plant to the Virtual Show Table Coordinator. The name of the orchid must be typed in the email or be part of the photo file name. No photos of plant labels will be allowed.
3. Entries are encouraged by the evening before the scheduled monthly meeting. Photos included in the presentation are at the discretion of the coordinator.
4. No Exhibitor Points will be awarded at the July or August Virtual Meetings. Members exhibiting in these meetings are encouraged to participate and speak about their plants in the presentation.

### ***Show Table Etiquette***

Please be considerate and thoughtful. Every member should be able to return home with their plants in the same condition they were brought in. If you can't see or smell a plant well enough as it sits, look at the entry form for the owner's name and seek them out.

When adding plants to a class, place taller plants in the background with shorter plants in the front – don't hide someone else's plant. You may need to seek out other owners to help you make space for your plant. Do not handle plants that are not your own. Do not bend flower spikes for any reason.



Thank you to members who gave their time to volunteer to do a presentation.

In an effort to increase EC awareness and attendance, we wish to bring attention to the fact there is a monthly Education Corner presentation beginning at 7:15 pm. We will make an announcement of the presenter, and topic at 7:12 pm. This leaves time to wrap up a conversation by the 7:15 pm start.

Any member is encouraged to do a 15-minute presentation on a basic orchid related topic, then guide a 15-minute Q & A afterwards.

9. How I use/set up LED lights in my house.
10. How I use the Internet/ Social medias/ AI to grow better orchids.
11. 5 cultural habits I learned to be disastrous for my orchids.
12. 5 helpful hints I learned by talking with other MOS members.
13. Show 5 actual or photos of orchids that had or have a problem, possibilities for correcting the problem.

## Clark's Corner

### What is Your Favorite Orchid and Why?

Chances are the first orchid you bought is still one of your favorites. After all, there was something about that plant, that flower that called to you, despite the — false — stories that “orchids are hard to grow.” You bought it, it grew, and you sought advice on its care from the orchid community including the Maryland Orchid Society. Now you have 10, 100, or 1,000+ orchid plants and love them all. But there’s a special place in your heart for that first plant.

The first check box for being a favorite would be the flower. Maybe it was the size. Or the unique color, or the plant presentation. Or maybe it was just plain weird. That’s often the case for first orchids acquired at an orchid show! Over the years, orchids of that genus will often form the majority of your collection, and you’ll add more — whether you “need” them or not.

For me, my first love was *and is* the Yellow Ladyslipper, *Cypripedium pubescens*. I killed that first plant in a matter of months — I was only 6 years old and that was 68 years ago. Close on its heels were *Cattleyas*, given to me as back bulbs that I successfully sprouted and grew in a west window in an apartment in the 1950s. I still love the *Cattleyas*, especially the little red ones and the marvelously fragrant semi-albas.

- Start now deciding which of your plants you are willing to donate. You have probably been repotting and dividing your plants and need to make room for new acquisitions.
- Plants that perform well: Species plants, particularly rare ones, in bloom Phragmipediums, Paphiopedilums, Catasetinae, Habenaria, Blooming Cattleya alliance plants- small catts, brassocatts, mini catts.
- Large specimen plants tend to be undervalued at our auction, particularly if not in bloom.

#### Check List for your Donation Plants

Healthy and Pest free plants only Please	This is not the time to unload underperforming weak plants.
A plant that is healthy, but you have established will not bloom in your growing conditions can be donated.	Are your labels legible and accurate - you may need to remake the label
Plants with no label need a label indicating NOID and to the best of your knowledge the plant type and color	Groom your plants where necessary, clean leaves, stake inflorescences. Etc. Does your plant look like something you would want to purchase?
Plants in Bud or Bloom will bring more money for the Society	Take and keep digital pictures of your plants in bloom
Bare root healthy divisions are acceptable and must be labeled.	If your plant will not be in bloom at the auction, please make a picture label.





The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce to the members that the 2025 Bylaws were adopted at a Special Board Meeting on May 27 and resumed on June 12, by a majority vote exceeding two-thirds of the total number of Trustees then in office as required by the 2019 Bylaws.

A Bylaw review committee team was assembled in December 2024 consisting of two past Presidents, current President and Vice President, one current Director, one current Committee Chair and one member at large. The task at hand was to examine the current 2019 MARYLAND ORCHID SOCIETY, INC. BYLAWS.

The high-level objectives set were presentation and readability, updates to technology utilization phrasing, correct inconsistencies in Bylaws, frequency of Board meetings and additional elements as the committee identified. The committee had major discussions on integrated opportunities related to number of Officers, size of the Board of Trustee for Governance, number of Board meetings, and committee structure.
