Bob Travers "An Experiment in Inverse Potting"

Miltonia Anne Warne 'Robert C' (CCM/AOS (85 points) Dec 07, 2019)

I grew up in the Towson/Parkville area of Baltimore County and attended Essex

Community College and worked for Becton Dickinson in Hunt Valley.

There are a few cherished plants: *Guarianthe Skinneri* which was given to me by a coworker from Puerto Rico who sent me a small division from his plant growing on a tree in his yard, *Paph F.C. Puddle 'Superbum'* CCM/AOS 89 points, my first AOS Award in 2018 the plant was given to me by Bud Hammond. It is the first Paph. hybrid for all white blooms registered in 1932, *Paph Harrisianum* the first Paph hybrid registered in 1869.

I have always considered growing orchids to be lifelong experiment, and as an experiment you never know where it will take you. In the program we will cover where the inverse potting idea came from, why you could choose this option, and my hypothesis.

Next, we will cover in detail how I accomplished the inverse potting. Follow up over several years of cultural success, and then the unanticipated twists and turns of the rest of the story.

Clark's Corner



Plastic, "Clay," or Wood?

Choosing a container for your growing orchids is a decision that involves a lot of factors. The most widely used containers are made of plastic, terra cotta (aka. "clay"), or wooden slats. In fairness, I also need to acknowledge mounts such as cork or tree fern, but those are another discussion for another time.

Plastic. Modern plastic pot benefits include 1. Lightweight, 2. Cheap, 3. Good for keeping even moisture, and 4. Easy cleaning with hot soaping water and a little light scrubbing. Downsides include 1. Can hold too much water leading to rapid media breakdown and rot, and 2. Lightweight leading to easily tipped plants. Plastic pots are particularly well suited for ladyslippers, thin-leaved genera, and terrestrials.

Terra cotta. Classic "clay" pot benefits include 1. Stability due to their weight, 2. Rapid absorption of excess water into the porous structure of the pot, 3. Strength to allow the use of hangars to get plants up into higher light, and 4. Ability to be sterilized in a hot oven. Downsides include 1. Weight, 2. Tendency to dry out too quickly, 3. Expense, and 4. They are easily broken. Terra cotta pots are particularly well suited to large *Cattleyas* and *Oncidiums*.

Wooden baskets. Typically made of slats of cedar or teak (\$\$), benefits include 1. Extreme drainage and abundant air at the roots, and 2. Unrestricted room for roots to roam. Downsides include 1. Care needed to structure the media so it doesn't fall out, 2. The baskets rot after a decade or so, and 3. Difficulty watering in the home environment. Wooden baskets are particularly well suited to *Vandas*, and moss growers such as *Sophronitis*, *Bulbophyllums*, and *Masdevallias*.

I use all of these — and mounts on cork — in my growing area. The choice is really up to the orchids. By having a good stock of all the different containers, you can tailor your care for the best plants. *Clark Riley*

October 4 There will be an education session on "Cattleya Toshi Aoki hybrids" by Hong Zhang starting 11 am. AOS Judging will start at noon.




